Monterey County Workforce Development Board to partner with Bloom Energy
for a series of recruitments in September

Wednesday, August 31, 2022, Salinas, CA-- The Monterey County Workforce Development Board is gearing up to host a series of recruitments for Bloom Energy throughout the month of September.
